In cities where protests took place on April 9, the date is noted in parentheses. According to organizers of the National Day of Action, no protests were planned in 13 U.S. states: Alaska, Delaware, Hawaii, Louisiana, Maryland, Montana, New Hampshire, North Dakota, Ohio, South Dakota, Vermont, West Virginia, or Wyoming. —The Editor
